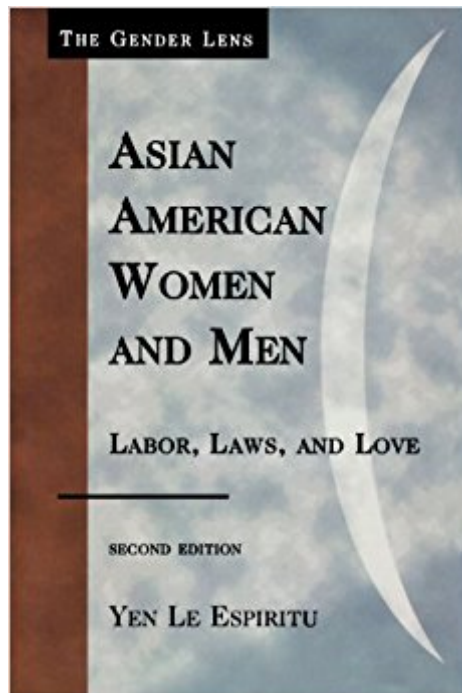

Espiritu emphasizes how race, gender, and class, as categories of difference, do not parallel but instead intersect and confirm one another.
