

A favorite of birdwatchers (especially those who prefer photographs to illustrations), this field guide, revised for 2000, accounts for the 544 bird species that live in the region west of the Great Plains. The clearly printed color photographs capture birds at rest and in flight; preceded by black-and-white silhouettes, the plates are organized by visually based, intuitive categories--"hawk-like birds," "pigeon-like birds," and "perching birds," for example--that make on-the-fly identification a fairly simple matter. The images are matched by clearly written text that describes a given bird, gives an approximation of its voice, and details its habitat, range, nests, and

behavior. Sized to fit in a jacket or backpack pocket, this is a valuable companion for any birding outing in the region. --Gregory McNamee

So, when an occasion arose to buy a bird book for a gift, this was the one I chose. The clear photographs and in-depth written descriptions, plus info on habitat, range, etc. make it very helpful. I also like the soft leather-like cover.

One of the best bird identification books out there. The beautiful photos alone are worth the purchase. The descriptions are very clear and it was the first time we were able to identify some specific species of birds that are so closely related to one another. Now instead of saying, "I saw a hawk," I can say, "I saw a zone-tailed hawk."

Pictures are dark and dated - this hasn't been updated since 1994. Waaaay overdue for a refresh and better photos.

Just what I was looking for...a guide with photos and excellent descriptions!

Photos are of good quality. I like the way plates are grouped with similar looking birds, which is good for comparison. However, because plates are all in a separate section from descriptive information,

it is cumbersome leaf back and forth, particularly when comparing similar birds - frequently jumping from two plates which may be together, but to two other separate reference pages for description information. I would prefer to have the descriptive information near the plates (even if the birds are different families), as well as prefer descriptive information pages to be of a higher mil. Good as a reference, but hard to use in field.
