

She has more than 25 years experience working with families of young children who have communication challenges as well as the children themselves. Ms. Sussman developed the More Than Words Program for the Hanen Centre. The program teaches parents how to structure everyday activities, such as getting dressed or playing with toys, to help their child learn to communicate. In addition to being the author of the parent guidebook, More Than Words, based on the content of the program, Ms. Sussman and wrote and directed an accompanying teaching videotape. Fern Sussman speaks on the Hanen approach to helping children with autism communicate and conducts training programs for Speech Language Pathologists and other professionals all over the world. Currently she is developing a new program and guidebook on social skills for families with young verbal children with autism.

My son is currently in speech therapy, and I had been doing a lot of improvised activities to encourage my son's speech and comprehension. I stumbled upon this book in a google search. I've had it for about a week, and have already seen improvements in my son's speech and comprehension by applying the tactics outlined in this book. Before reading this book, I wasn't really sure exactly what type of speech delay he had, or what the future held for us. This book definitely outlined the types of delays that are typical and how to get them to the next level. Before this book, I didn't even understand what the next level would be. I knew conversation was a goal of ours, but it just seemed in the the distant future. Now we have attainable goals and methods to get there. My son has not been diagnosed with autism, but he fits the descriptions in this book. With the help and suggestions in "More than Words," my son has already started expressing ideas that he wasn't last week. I also recommend the "action" flash cards advertised on as well. The photos are bright and colorful - and my son loves them!! would recommend this book to anyone with a child with a speech/comprehension delay.

This book came highly recommended to us from several speech and language pathologists at the Kennedy Krieger Institute working with our daughter as a way to supplement our own communication with our 3 year-old with autism. It's targeted towards younger children and helps parents integrate learning in play-based settings using methodology set forth by the Hanen Centre. They warned me, though, that despite the fact that the book is still being printed, the prices on is far above its retail recommended price. For parents who are already coping with the emotional and huge financial burden of treating children with ASD, it was helpful to be informed that I didn't have to be taken advantage of and end up paying double for a book (that is still worth double, but still). I think you can get this item for its listed price through the Hanen Centre and the Special Needs Project.

I'm reviewing the availability of this book, as it was recommended by our autism clinic. Unfortunately, the book is unavailable to those who can't drop \$50 for a used copy. The public library does not have a copy. It's too bad people who start out with good intentions, can be so overcome with greed.
