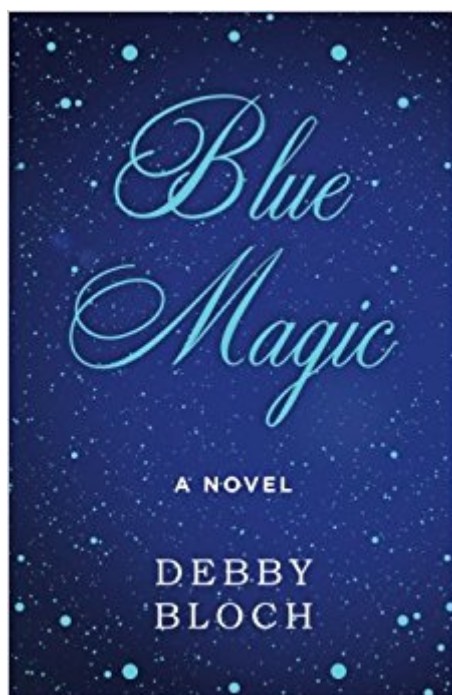

Debby Bloch understands the journeys so many women undertake to seek love, friendship, purpose, and acceptance. She made a series of life-changing decisions that moved her to an entirely different path. After a fulfilling professional career, Bloch enrolled in the University of San Francisco MFA program and became a novelist. Bloch has published the novel *That Old Song* and

Dance and a series of nonfiction guides about professional skills and career choices. Bloch and her husband, Martin, split their time between San Francisco and Ashland, Oregon. She was inspired to write her latest novel, *Blue Magic*, while attending the Oregon Shakespeare Festival in Ashland.

Reviews of books are typically written after the last page is read and a little literary processing passes by in consideration of what was just absorbed. And I suppose I could have written a review of "*Blue Magic*" when I put it down on the coffee table several weeks ago. That would have been easy and I could have written a glowing review. Full disclosure I know the author and we have been friends since before either of us had to gum our food. Personally, in many instances, the joy that I get from reading comes not just during the story as page turns into page, characters develop, and situation leads to situation. The joy doesn't necessarily come even as the story moves to eventual denouement, but rather from the overall feeling that remains after the experience. In many cases I can't recall what might have happened in a book that I enjoyed a few years back; however, I can recall vividly the mood created at the time of reading, whether one of joy or dread. I can take an old book off the shelf and smile with the memory of how much I enjoyed it, or frown as I remember how much I thought it was a waste of paper. With that in mind, I chose to wait a bit before crafting a review of "*Blue Magic*" for my friend and mentor. And speaking of full disclosure, if I didn't know the author, I would have never pulled this one down off the shelf. This is not my "type" of reading. All in all, it's an introspective romance, and although I may at times be introspectively romantic, I don't typically spend three hundred pages of my time with one. Having said that, "*Blue Magic*" is quite good and I raced through it rather quickly because I enjoyed spending the time within the pages. There are touches of, for lack of a better word, the paranormal and some witchy sister stuff within, all which drive the story. But at the core is a slice in the life of our main character, Edwyna and a single woman's search for someone to compliment her in life as a partner. We've read the story before. We've met Edwynas before. We've read about single women and the manure they have to shovel to find a suitable date let alone partner. "*Blue Magic*" is not new in that sense. Now, remember the part about the feeling after finishing the book? Well, I'm looking at it on my desk right now and what comes to mind is, "Gee. I sure did enjoy spending time with that woman. I wonder how she's doing now?" "*Blue Magic*," in that sense, is fresh. It makes us long to visit with an old friend again, even after our time with her has passed

by. There were times I felt Edwynna to be a bit annoying, but aren't we all a little annoying from time to time? There were moments when I felt her too gullible especially at the unusual things that happen around her that she brushes off, things that might have me running for the hills. But gullibility often adds to the genuineness of a character. And Edwynna is genuine. She knows who she is and for the most part, she knows what she wants. There is a lot of garbage on the market, and I read a lot of it. A significant bit of it is what I call good garbage - those books that pretend to be nothing other than pulp fiction. "Blue Magic" is not garbage in any sense at all. It's literature for the intelligent reader, one with an interest in the introspectively romantic, spiritualism, feminism, friendship and love. It's for readers that enjoy well-defined characters and crisp, true-to-the-ear dialogue. And it's also for those that simply enjoy a comfortable read so that a few weeks later they can sit back and wonder what might Edwynna be up to these days. Debby Bloch's "Blue Magic" is worth the time. It's as simple as that. Get it. Read it. And enjoy.
