

Six months into her stay with her foster parents, Katie Parker is finally adjusting to her new family. But after a tornado rips through the town of In Between, nothing is ever the same again. When her foster mom, Millie, is diagnosed with cancer, Katie begins to doubt if God really does care. What will happen to Katie? Could she possibly have to leave In Between and the family she's come to depend on? Things spiral even further out of control when Katie juggles a science fair project, a malfunctioning best friend, spring break plans, and holding the attention of her own Prince Charming. It's going to take more than a glass slipper and some fairy dust to fix Katie Parker's problems. But will help come in time?

Jenny B. Jones is the author of A Katie Parker Production series, including the book In Between. Though now an adult, she still relates to the trauma and drama of teen life. Jenny is thrilled to see her writing dreams come true, as her previous claim to fame was singing the national anthem at a mule-jumping championship. The author and high school teacher resides in Arkansas.

I read through Book 2 immediately after reading Book 1. Katie Parker is a great female protagonist. I would definitely recommend this series to anyone who enjoys a well written YA novel. As the series progresses, I find myself falling for Katie's quirky foster family. That's the REAL love story that's been progressing from Book 1 through Book 2, the love a family coming together. Sixteen year old Katie does have a love interest in this book, but that storyline takes a backseat to the love she shares with her new support system of good friends and a great foster family. Loved this book!*There's a stronger Christian thread in Book 2 than in Book 1, but I didn't feel as if the author's beliefs were being crammed down my throat. This is a clean read, but NOT sickening sweet. Like Book 1, A few tears were shed by this reader for fictional Katie Parker. If I could meet this character, I'd give her a hug. She's fantastic!!!

Now having spent six months with her foster parents, 16-year-old Katie Parker feels bonded with James and Millie Scott. She's made some close friends at school and church, and even learned to deal with her kooky foster grandma Maxine. Yet just when she's started to feel a bit grounded for the first time in her life, Katie receives devastating news... Millie has cancer. Katie can't believe it. How could such a good woman like her foster mom be hit with something like that? It makes no sense to Katie, who is still struggling to understand the faith that the Scotts embrace. Understandably, Katie is filled with a range of emotions, from anger to sorrow to helplessness. Yet as time passes, she begins to gain a little glimpse of what God is all about. Thanks to her best friend Frances and other new friends, Katie also learns - for the first time in her life - what it means to not be alone. Jones' characters feel true to life...and although there is a distinctly religious thread running throughout, it is by no means dominating the book. Katie is quick-witted and often sarcastic (in a humorous and likable way). Readers can't help but root for Katie to find what she has been searching for.

Even though this series was written for teenagers, and at 62, I am a senior citizen, this is a wonderful story about the battles Katie is working with. Learning to trust the foster family, even when their long lost daughter returns home. This is about Katie finally getting "it". Learning what great things our God did for victims of a tornado that destroyed homes in the area and hearing only praises to God for the outcome. Lives saved!

This is a fun book to read. It is filled with sass, quirkiness, faith, insights and many of life's struggles and God's faithfulness. Funny characters and a funny storyline.
