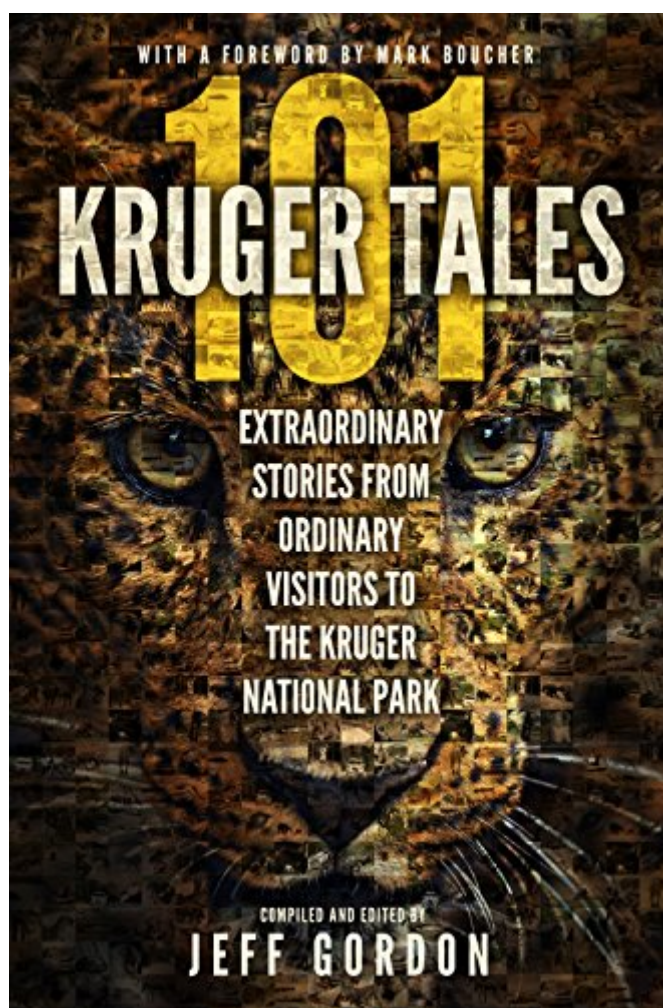

As a frequent visitor to South African parks we found this book most entertaining and fascinating. A very good light read proving that anything can happen in the parks but one always seems to come out on the right side! It also reflects the gross stupidity of some visitors to the parks who will hopefully heed these warnings and obey the park rules in future. The reason park rules are made becomes abundantly clear as one reads through the book! We wish we could have had some of the experiences written about in the book, and are equally grateful NOT to have had some of them! We would recommend this book to anyone visiting game parks in Africa.

If you haven't bought it yet you should be ashamed! 101 stories --- mostly memories of people who have had experiences in-situ --- brilliantly told in short (really short and crisp and to the point --- well done) stories about individual or family events while visiting the world's greatest wild life reserve. Some dramatic and some light-hearted, but all of them colorful and awash with the smell and sounds of --- the bush! Will some of the proceeds benefit the near-extinct Rhino? Not sure but here's hoping. My greatest fear is that soon we shall only see the rhino in zoos, and the rhino will only experience existence in cages. Kruger is the last room in Nature's House and, it needs attention.

As an introduction to incidents in game parks this book was excellent. The author recorded tales sent to him that illustrated the unpredictability of animals... and people when their paths cross in the animals' territory. Each story was a few pages in length which made for a good pick up and put down book when there were a few minutes to spare. The author obviously loves the outdoors as his forwards suggest and accepts the stupidity that tourists bring to many situations when an error can bring death. Fortunately most of the stories have a happy ending for all concerned.

Reading the experiences from visitors to the park was great. Tense, exciting and also educational all in one great book. Hard to put down. I read at night before turning out the light for my nights rest and this book never kept me awake with worry and not once was there a lion in my bedroom either. I think it would be a good book to read to older children and what a fun discussion it would bring.

This is the perfect book to bring back memories of many a trip to the Kruger National Park I have taken. I had heard of some of the stories before by going on the San Parks forum but many were unfamiliar and some were unbearably sad. The tales are short so it is a great book to pick up and go back to again. It also is a must for anyone planning to visit the KNP as it helps to bring the various locales alive
