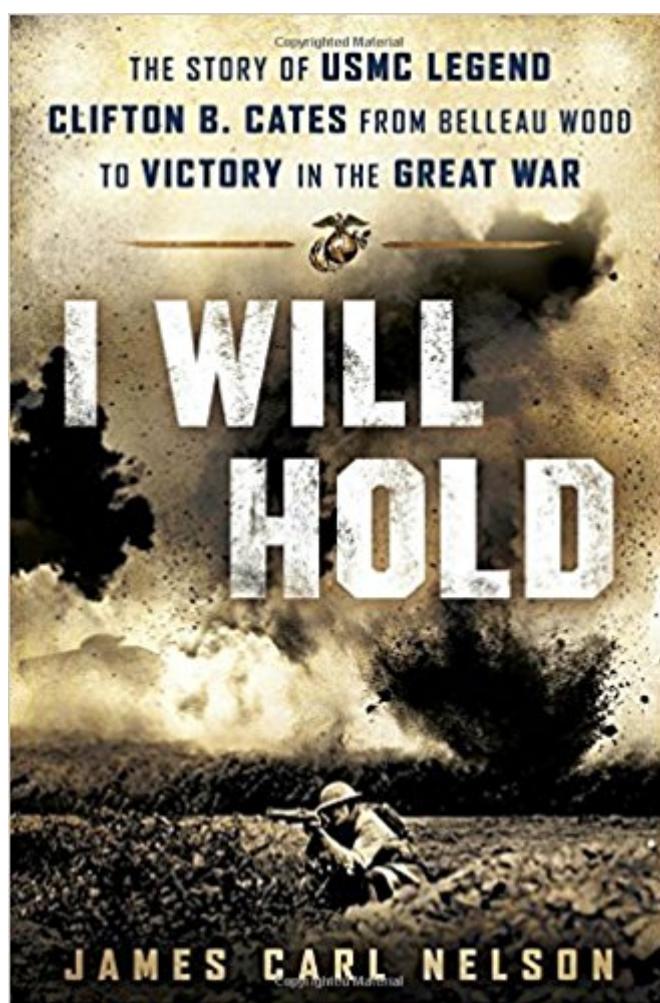

Cates knew that he and his small band of marines were in a desperate spot. Before handing the note over to a runner, he added three words that would resound through Marine Corps history: I WILL HOLD. From the moment he first joined the Marine Reserves of the American Expeditionary Force in World War I, Clifton B. Cates was determined to make his mark as a leader. Little did he know what he would truly accomplish in his legendary career. Not as well-known as his contemporaries such as Alvin C. York, his fame would not come from a single act of heroism but from his consistent and courageous demeanor throughout the war and beyond. In the bloody second half of 1918 with the 6th Marine Regiment, he was awarded the Navy Cross, the Distinguished Service Cross, the Purple Heart, the Silver Star, was recognized by the French government with the Legion of Honor and the Croix de Guerre, and earned the nickname "Lucky." I will read this again and again, and will encourage my students to do so as well!

Anyone interested in the history of the Marine Corps will find this book very informative. I feel this book explains some of the reasons certain Army officers had it "in" for my Marine Corps. In Korea, under Army command and at the end of the army supply they certainly did us few favors!

Having read dozens of WWII chronicles of men in combat, it's still surprising to me how few have been written about its precursor, World War I. James Carl Nelson's "I Will Hold: The Story of USMC Legend Clifton B. Cates, from Belleau Wood to Victory in the Great War" is an unsung hero-type saga that stands up to the powerful expectations of readers who know their military history. I'm still slightly bewildered that the tale of future USMC Commandant Clifton B. Cates had to wait nearly a century to be told, but here it is, a terrific read...

An in-depth account of one marine and his leadership ability during WWI. The last couple of chapters really expose the vanity of the generals and their insatiable desire during the last 12 hours of the war.

This is a very good companion book to the author's other book The Remains of Company D. The Marines were at Soissons down the line a ways from the author's grandfather whose Company D was featured in the author's other book. . I would have liked a few maps to follow the progress of the battles, but the book was not designed as a treatise of military strategy/doctrine. It is well written in a way that maintains the interest of the reader. I recommend this book.

You don't find much about the Marines in WWI outside stories of Belleau Wood. It follows Cates through his Marine Corps career with the primary focus being on WWI. I would love to see a follow up on his time in WWII and commandant during the Korean Conflict with the challenges of trying to save the Corps from being disbanded and rolled into the Army.

General Clifton Cates is from the next county west of my hometown, just 10 miles away. It was great reading about his WWI experience. The Lake County Armory is named for him, and a new

Mississippi River landing is named Cates Landing for his family's original farm.

The subject of this book is Marine Lieutenant Clifton Cates who fought at the battle of Belleau Wood and the subsequent battles that followed. Some great insights to the man who would later become Commandant of the Marine Corps.
