

If you make it only about the money, it will only be about the money. If you make it about adding value and the relationship, then money madew or lost is a lagging not leading indicator of how well we have formed the relationship.3) Write your own Obituary:This is a great way to design living a purposeful life. Begin with the End in mind First. Experience has showed me that ideally the time to work on becoming a good leader is before you're in the job, not when you're doing it. I've left a long corporate life & am now a self-employed consultant, but I still give Ken Blanchard's books to younger colleagues to give them an edge over the competition.

There are 2 main reasons I give this book 5 stars.#1 Although the subject of leadership has been written about innumerable times, Ken Blanchard reviews what is often already known into seemingly new territory because of the quotes before each chapter making the information succinct and broad all at the same time. Mind soil becomes fertile as each chapter reiterates some basic principles that might have been overlooked or even forgotten, but now grasped in an effective way. The quote at the beginning of each short chapter keep the readers mind from wandering into the many channels leadership can morph in to. #2 Another benefit of this information is a gold mine for the general reader who wants to improve their own leadership in their contact with friends and family thereby increasing their social skills.
