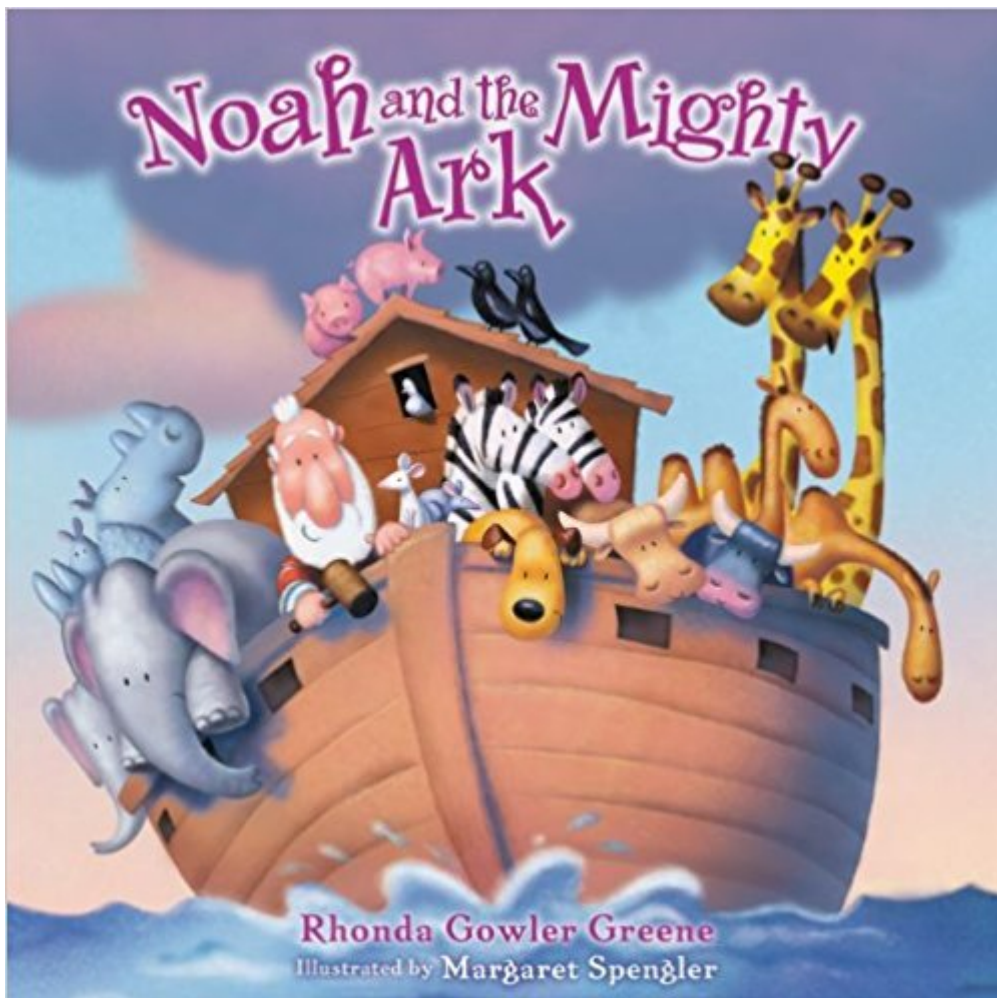

This rhymed version scans well, which encourages reading aloud. Except for the dark backgrounds that make the words hard to see at times, the book is well designed. Variations in type size and spacing work well with the text and add emphasis to crucial words. Cohen's illustrations feature a gray-bearded patriarch and dozens of animal pairs that children will enjoy identifying. The impressionistic style suggests shapes through use of shading and flowing lines. Although this rendition lacks the majestic qualities of Jerry Pinkney's Noah's Ark (SeaStar, 2002) or the bright intensity of Lucy Cousins's Noah's Ark (Candlewick, 1993), it is definitely worth considering for collections that need a new or replacement version of Noah's story.â "Kathy Piehl, Minnesota State University, Mankato Copyright Â© Reed Business Information, a division of Reed Elsevier Inc. As a pastor and Father I am always looking for Children's books that tell bible stories for my two young sons. Originally, I had purchased this book for my older son, but I think a very young child could appreciate this book just as well, because it's all about the bright and beautiful pictures. Of course this book retells the story of Noah's ark - which admittedly can be a hard subject matter for little ears. Despite what is painted on nursery walls, the story of Noah is not for children. I think the author does a wonderful job of shielding children from the more violent, scary aspects and stays true to the essence of the story. Again, I think the book works on many levels - small children will love the pictures and enjoy the book being read to them - and older children will enjoy being able to read it for themselves. Wonderful pictures and a wonderful story, well recommended.

I never get tired of the story of Noah and the building of the ark. It is such an important lesson that we need to teach our children from a very early age. They need to know about God's provision and His promises even in the storms of life. Rhonda Greene and Margaret Spengler have combined their talents to once again bring this account to life. You are sure to enjoy Rhonda's rhyming verse that explains in detail what took place all those years ago. Margaret's illustrations are bright and colorful and the characters have such sweet facial expressions. I appreciated how even the simplest of details about the story were covered. There are details such as the ark being covered in pitch and God Himself shutting the door, that will be important to your children in understanding some of the deeper meanings as they grow older. I can't express how much I love that these things were included and not glossed over. I feel like it is better to teach the story in the correct way from the beginning rather than having to unlearn some things later in life. This is a book that you can trust on the details even though it is a child's storybook. I received a copy of this book to facilitate my review.

This is an exceptional book for children that tells the story of Noah and the Ark in a rhyming, easy to remember way. It is written in such a way that a child of almost any age, especially the young ones, can relate to. It is filled with big, bright, colorful, wonderful illustrations that will capture your young readers attention immediately. My children ages 6 and 3 really loved reading this book. We read it

often, and have fun counting and naming all of the animals that go in and out of the ark. Plus there are a lot of fun sounds in here to have fun with as your reading. My kids got such a laugh out of that. Like when the snakes s-s-slither. The book is hardcover so sturdy enough for younger children without being heavy, and the pages are glossy and easy to turn. My favorite thing about this children's book is not only the story, but the fact that the author does a fantastic job of staying on track to tell the story accurately and in a short amount of time to capture a child's attention. It is put in a way the children can understand, and while you may need to explain a few little words to your young reader it is definitely worth it. The Bible verse Genesis 6:14-19 is included in the front of the book, and this is the verse on which the story is based. It helps connect the actual bible with the story and better opens discussion opportunities with your little one. I would recommend this book to any child's personal library, for a children's Sunday School class, etc. We have a lot of fun reading this book as a family for fun, and for a bedtime story. Books like this help our children understand the stories of God, and in a way they can more fully understand. This book is recommended for ages 4-8 although I think it fits even a bit younger, and maybe even a bit older children who still enjoy illustrated books and the rhyming technique of storytelling. Noah and the Mighty Ark is a delightful book set in rhyme for young children aged 4 to 8. It is filled with bright colourful pictures that beautifully complement the story. Even the endpapers are filled with monochrome pictures of the animals marching two by two towards the ark at one end of the book, an away from the ark at the other. Children will have fun with their parents counting the animals and naming them. There are animals from many different continents to be found in this book. This book can be a great catalyst for a variety of discussion and learning opportunities. The story is told in rhyming couplets, showing emphasis on words using italics, boldface type and changes in font size. The story is simply written so that children beginning to read will find success with this book. However the author also provides some challenges for language development such as learning more difficult words like *Åœdisembark* and *Åœpitch* (to make it float). A verse from the Bible (Genesis 6:14-19) is quoted at the beginning of the book which the story is based on. The story is accurately told in a way that will engage the young reader and help them understand the overall concepts of the Biblical event. The paper is a reasonably heavy weight with a slightly glossy finish. The book is hardcover so that it is durable for young children. I would

highly recommend Noah and the Mighty Ark to any family with young children. I would be a great addition to any library. I gave this book 5 stars out of 5.
