Woodall does a first rate job of writing her debut publication that thoroughly and delightfully describes young Americans in Europe in 1956-57. This memoir gave me a detailed impression of personal and historical events happening to students abroad in the 1950s, an era which I have little familiarity with, myself being born in the 1980s. I could not put this book down, nor keep from chuckling as I tried to imagine myself as Woodall during the time. In addition, WoodallÃfÂ¢à â  $\neg$ à â, ¢s book educated me on period details of France, Switzerland, Spain, Italy,

Germany and the UK in the 1950s as well as a thorough understanding of trends in classical music live performances and performers. I would recommend this book to both former and future students on journeys abroad, parents of students abroad, music and French aficionados, those heading to Europe for vacation, and anyone looking for a light, yet historical piece to read for leisure. Kudos to Woodall on a wonderful read!
