

Luckily Holly has two good friends but that is just not enough as her home life is awful, no music or computers or cell phones for her. Her dad hardly ever cooks so it is a lot of frozen things that are micro waved. Holly is really a good child, much more mature then her friends as she has to help clean, cook, make lunches and do lots of chores around the house.lvy Macintosh has hardly left her house in almost eight years since the tragic death of her three year old twins and her husband. When her father visits and tells her he is planning on retiring and wants to know if she would like to take over the business? Ivy could never think of taking over the business when in fact her own family died in one of the plane. Since then she is barely getting through the days and drinking at night to dull the pain. That begins to change, however, when eleven year old Holly Greenwood knocks on her door. Her father Daniel has kept it hidden from her but Holly's mother also died in the plane crash that killed Ivy $\tilde{A}f\hat{A}\phi\tilde{A}$ \hat{a} $\neg\tilde{A}$ \hat{a} , ϕ s family - all Holly knows is that she longs to sing but her father won't let her. Ivy finds herself increasingly drawn to both Holly and her father and begins to realize life may be worth living after all. Although it is set at Christmas time, $\tilde{A}f\hat{A}\phi\tilde{A}$ \hat{a} $\neg\tilde{A}$ \hat{A} . Daniel. Because of this, I found Ivy $\tilde{A}f\hat{A}\phi\tilde{A}$ \hat{a} $\neg\tilde{A}$ \hat{a} , ϕ s story and character to be much more developed compared to Daniel. Both families tragedy is heartbreakingly real but I felt it was a bit too drawn out. Compared to the back stories - the romance in the book is incredibly rushed, taking place over a few days. I enjoyed the romance - and the fact that it took place over Christmas - but compared to the early part of the book it wasn't really developed. This is a fast and easy book to read that will leave you not wanting to put the book down. The story line evolves around a child, Holly Greenwood, who lives with her widowed father. In the course of the story, Holly and her father meet Ivy, a widow who suffered the loss of her husband and 3 year old twins in a plane accident. Together Holly and Ivy, after a chance meeting, begin to chart a new beginning for her father and Ivy with happiness and hope for the future. If you typically love Hallmark movies, this book is similar and will uplift your hope for love and happiness for Holly's father and Ivy.

Holly and Ivy is an uplifting read about two families who have suffered tragedies and how they get on with life and finally how they start to heal. The characters are engaging from the eleven year old Holly to the widow Ivy. I don't read a lot of Fern Michaels, but reading this makes me wonder why. Michaels is a good writer who makes her characters come alive. Her stories have very human components that have you relating to the characters and the story even if you haven't the

experiences that the characters do. This book is no exception. This is a great Christmas read full of love and healing.
