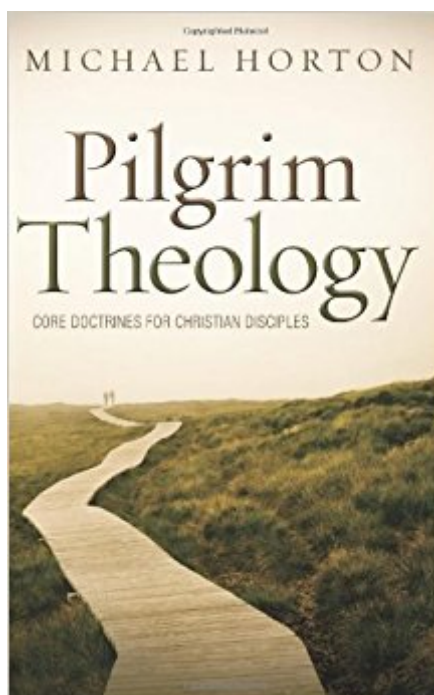

Michael Horton (PhD, DD) is Professor of Systematic Theology and Apologetics at Westminster Seminary California. Author of many books, including *The Christian Faith: A Systematic Theology for Pilgrims on the Way*, he also hosts the White Horse Inn radio program. He lives with his wife, Lisa, and four children in Escondido, California.

Michael Horton's theology volume in 2011 (*The Christian Faith*) is superb and moves to the front of

the line in theological Reference Volumes for those of the Reformed and Covenant faith. Now, Horton has taken that large reference volume and put it on a lower shelf to be reachable and readable to all the family members. This is the first time I have ever seen a book on theology edited to be used for the family, to be edited in a format that is readable and allows for questions and discussion for families. The free resource that comes with the book is a great reference tool that indexes both books! You can use this small resource to index the topic in Pilgrim Theology and it gives you the same page numbers in the larger volume for extra study and insight.
