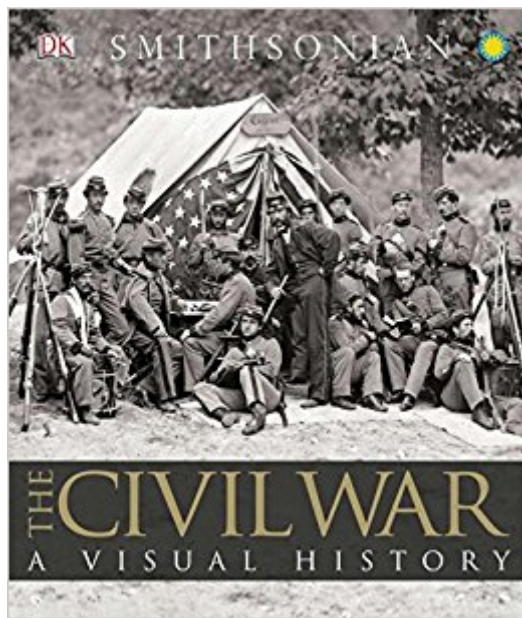

My husband and I fell in love with DK (especially the Smithsonian line) during a trip to the Smithsonian museums. The books are filled with an immense amount of information which is presented in a fascinating, readable way. Of course the author couldn't include absolutely every single detail about the subject at hand, but they still did a wonderful job. The photos are gorgeous and a perfect complement to the information being presented. The books themselves have sturdy binding and stout construction.

I've only skimmed through this book so far, but it is visually stunning. Like the Smithsonian Definitive Guide on World War II, this book delivers lots of timelines, sidebars profiles and a remarkable mix of paintings, period photos and layouts on weapons and accoutrements of mid 19th century warfare to excite Civil War buffs and novices alike. And, like the World War II book, it may shed some new light on the causes of the war, the battles and the personalities -- but it's strength lies in telling a straight-line narrative complemented by lots of great eye candy. A great addition to any Civil War library.
