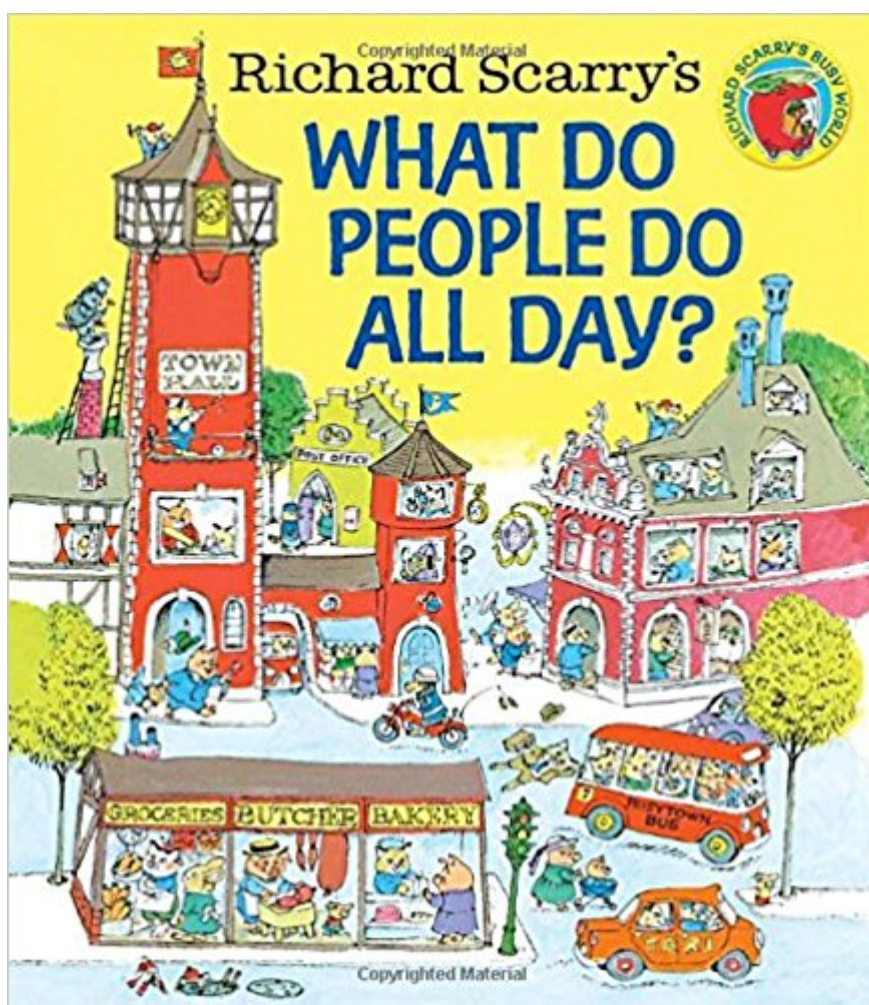

Gave this to my 3 year old who loves books. He is fairly particular about what he reads but if something catches his attention he'll sit for over an hour while we read. These Richard Scarry books are amazing. Enough words on the pages but not too many. But sooo much to look at on the page we can take as long or as short as we want per page. And the book is plenty long (with 2 page stories) that he could read for forever or as short as I decide. He got this book 6 months ago and it's still his go-to bedtime book. We own "Cars, and Trucks, and Things that Go", "What do people do all day", and "Busy Busy World". He loves them all. He usually moves on from a favorite story book after a few weeks but these he keeps coming back to month after month. We like to rotate our small library by packing away some books for a few months but these have never been put away.

A bit dated but good for a laugh or two. Illustrations are great it's just hard to get around what "mommies do" all day long.

Richard Scarry was one of my husband's favorite authors when he was growing up. We gave three of his books to each of our grand nephews for Christmas this past year. We have only received glowing reports from all families. My husband was on a business trip and went into the new American Express Centurion Airport Lounge at the George Bush International Airport in Houston Texas. He was checking out the new digs and stuck his head into the children's playroom to look around and saw Scarry's book "Cars and Trucks and Things That Go". He took a picture of it, tested it to me, and asked me to please order these books for Cassel, Tate and Nico. I did, and now we receive pictures and video of the little boys (2 1/2 -3 yrs) reading and perusing the books with their folks and even by themselves. Great rediscovery for the kids.

Probably the best of his many books on peoples' occupations and on our other daily topics. My grandsons adore the different scenarios presented by Scarry in this book. These grandsons have Scarry's book on transportation, which is very good as well. And they have also read some of his other books which were loaned to them from the local library. This edition is updated from when my children were read the same Scarry books, but still more or less current, nevertheless...except for the story on mining...which reviews "coal, the sunshine in the ground", and on what do "Mothers do all day". Definitely not politically correct, either topic, but still readable.

I purchased this for my son (3 years old) for Christmas as he is in love with the other Richard Scarry

book (Cars & Trucks & Things That Go). We were not disappointed. He loves the huge brightly colored, detailed drawings. The book has several mini stories inside - like what do we do with wood, what does water do for us, how do we make bread, etc. and follows several characters going through their day to day jobs. My son also loves to find Lowly Worm on each page, just like he found Goldbug in the other Scarry book. It has everything I remember from my childhood and will likely be a nightly read for my son and I for years to come. Pros:- Huge pages with detailed, colorful illustrations- Educational content about occupations Cons:- None (besides that I've been asked to read it so much I have it memorized)

Captivating detail for preschoolers. Still a little retro for my tastes. Almost all the jobs are held by men. Otherwise a great read my daughter returns to again and again.

This book is a classic. Each page gives detailed pictures with lots to look at. Since it is a classic, it shows people doing something other than sit in front of computers all day.
