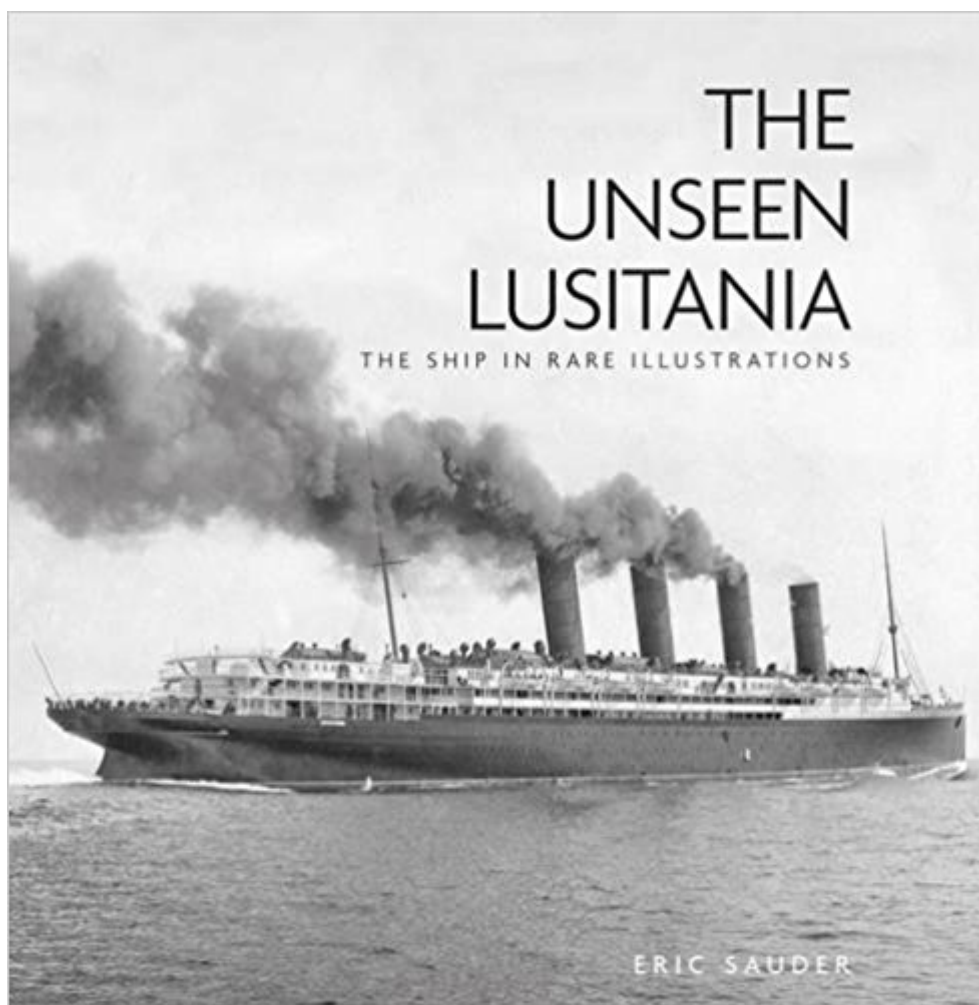

I had an uncle that was an Able Bodied Seaman (deck crew). I believe that he was in the baggage compartment when the torpedo hit. Actually being able to see where he was and worked is fascinating. I don't have any photos of him, I may have seen him and not known it.

As a pictorial edition, hard to beat. Plenty of apparent builders' photos with clear resolution for the period. However I would have liked to have seen more engine space photos as these were the heart of these two vessels. The photos on the dust jacket taken on the trials really demonstrate the power of the ship. But fewer potted palms and more turbines would have told the whole story. The actual disaster is not covered extensively, or well. While this may not have been the remit of this book, the whole story could have benefited with a more thorough explanation of the where's and why's. The Robert Ballard and Ken Marschall version a few years back tells the complete story.
