

Gives appropriate and inappropriate responses and behaviors without being condescending. I can't help but be encouraged and sometimes laugh at the illustrations that do so much to capture the nuances and defuse some of the awkwardness ... ie, the illustration of "pointing with your lips" both makes the instance very clear without making it seem outlandish. So for any American or "Joe" traveling to the Philippines, any of us born outside the Philippines doing your "roots" trip, or anyone who wants to know more about us as a people, I'd recommend this book.
