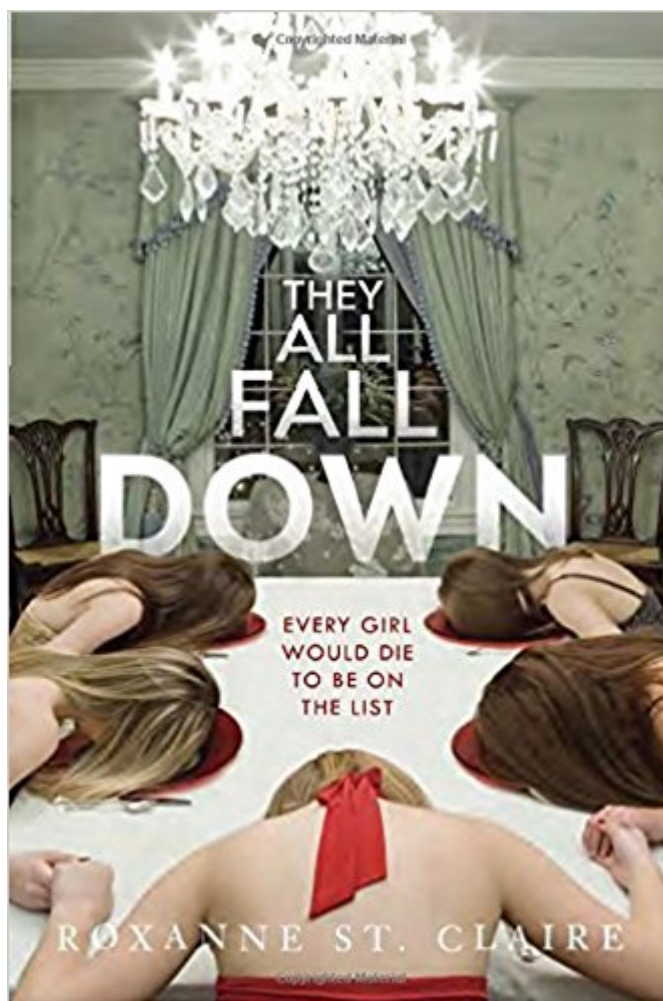

Especially after reading the synopsis, and for the most part it did deliver. *They All Fall Down* starts with our heroine Mackenzie who is just your average type typical girl next door, whose striving to get through school so she can get on to better things, such as college, to where the memory of her beloved brothers death, and split family might be a thing of the past. But everything turns around when she finds out that she is part of the schools much anticipated "Hottie List." A list that only has ten of the hottest girls in the school, and Kenzie is still struggling to figure out how she managed to land on it...that is until the ultimate hottie himself, Josh, rolls up to her with a wicked smile that melts her brain. Figuring the list is stupid, but could put her in the vicinity of Mr. Hottie Kenzie just goes along with it. That is until the girls start having accidents...accidents that can't be explained, and when deaths start to occur rumors fly of a curse on the girls on the hottie list. And if that isn't unnerving enough to Kenzie the bad boy at school now has his eye on her too, and while her blood may run hot at the thought of Josh, it's absolutely an inferno when Levi looks at her. But all these thoughts go flying out of her head once the girls numbers start to dissipate, and she realizes she's next. It's up to her and her loyal friends to help figure this mystery out before her time is up. This book truly had so much going for it! Great characters that you rallied for, and each supporting character had a great personality that matched their actions, and were totally believable. The main character was written well, and the plot was very good! I love a great mystery, and this book really did hold my attention until the end.
