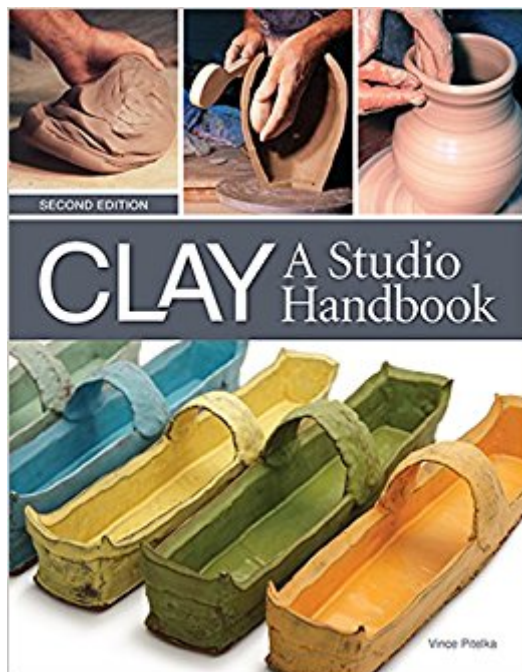

Brush up (or catch up) on techniques as diverse as nerikomi (p. 118) and mishima (p. 108), or explore an unconventional approach to slab building. This is the most practical, hands-on reference book on clay you can own. Whether you're a seasoned professional, a teacher, a student, or a determined dabbler, Clay A Studio Handbook is a valuable resource you don't want to be without. You'll go back to it again and again. There's just no way to hold all this information in your head all the time after all, you need some mental space to let inspiration roll around a little.
