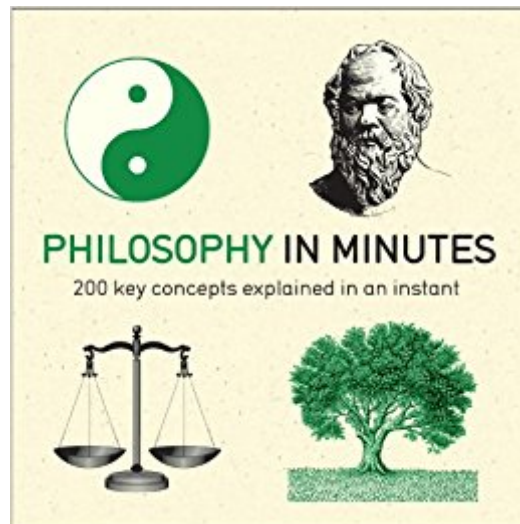

Fun, easy to read, game changer. The author(s) did their due diligence, producing a masterpiece. A must buy for any alert individual!

This may be good for browsing, but not as a reference book. The entries are often too short to be useful, even as introductions. They are arranged by subject, and I often thought that the "ologies"

dealt with should have been put under different rubrics than they were. There is an index, but it is not as helpful as one would hope. If one is looking for "postmodernism," one can only find it if one happens to read the paragraph on "post-structuralism." Many pages contain unenlightening drawings: some are supposed to be humorous, but they are not.

Though each concept was summarized very briefly, I felt like they explained a majority of the core points very well for the most part. I did not often feel like the short length of each idea sacrificed an adequate summary of the concept. In addition, the summaries were very clear and easy to understand. This has been a very good way for me to get a solid understanding of some major philosophical ideas I had been curious about for a long time and has encouraged me to take my search further and discover more things to consider. I feel like this book was a very good starting point for me in my discovery of philosophy.
