

The content of this book is wonderful! There are many neat ideas for creatively teaching the lessons of the weekly Parasha to children. The only minor disappointment in this purchase was a cosmetic flaw- that being that the printing on the front and back covers has distorted areas. Being as this book was purchased "new" I wasn't expecting this.

This is a great reference book for any Jewish preschool teacher. However I would of liked it to be a little more thorough with arts and crafts and things to do to relate to the weekly portion I thought there would be a little more to it.

If you buy one book for your classroom this year, it is Morah Morah Teach Me Torah. This book literally changed the way I taught Torah in the classroom and the way I understood it for myself. I first got my hands on this book when it literally hit print, and I since then it is my "go to" book for teaching Torah to my Sunday School kids, the keystone for reviewing Torah for myself, and the text I use for teaching Jewish educators. The best part is, the book is all inclusive: take home pages, activities, lessons, the script to read etc... If you are out sick for a day, your sub will be able to literally pick up where you left off and go! I have used this book for several years now, and each time I teach a parsha, I take a different approach. While the text is aimed at a 5 day a week preschool program, I used it for Sunday School, for Tot Shabbats, for Adult education and for a special Torah class I taught for tots. There is so much in there; it is easy to tweak it to fit whatever classroom venue you have. Additionally, I have used the text and activities for my older children. I have used this for ages 2 up to age 10 and everyone found meaning in it. On a personal level, Morah Morah Teach ME Torah gave me the confidence to delve into all of the Torah portions, even the ones I used to avoid. It challenged me to learn more Torah for myself and to find that grain of relevancy in each portion that can be taught to the children. The Torah might be "The Book," but I can tell you that Morah Morah Teach Me Torah is a close second. :) Buy it -- you WILL NOT be let down!

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
