

Sigfried Giedion (1888â⠬⠜1968) taught at the Federal Institute of Technology and was Mellon Lecturer at the Washington National Gallery and the Charles Elliot Norton Lecturer at Harvard University. His other works include Space, Time, and Architecture and The Eternal Present.

This is to replace a book I used in college and have regularly referred students to. Apparently I lent it out once too often. The ideas still intrigue me and are still relevant, even if the writing isn't quite scintillating.

(Mechanization Takes Command isn't a "product"...Dear, please remember your origins.) That said, Mechanization Takes Command is one of those rare books written by someone who understands technology over the centuries and also understands civilization. This book should be re-printed. Giedion's other great book, Space, Time & Architecture, is still in print and assigned at architectural schools.
