

Much of the material is specific and detailed yet Kaufman manages to describe the general principles for understanding the appearance, behavior and vocalization of birds. The first third of the book is a great resource to improve your birding skills. The remainder deals with keying out the most troublesome groups. It will most definitely be in the car whenever I go after gulls, shorebirds and epidonaxes.
