I have been an avid woodworker for about 15 years. I enjoy many types of projects, but i gravitate towards box making and joinery. I became interested in woodworking by helping my kids with their Pinewood derby cars. From design to painting and sealing my kids were involved in every aspect of their cars. Now, teenagers we look back at those times with great fondness.Most kids seem to gravitate towards building things at some point in their lives. Woodworking for Young Makers aims to get them beyond the initial confusion of what to make and how to start, and get the kids to focus on what needs to be done. The book is highly illustrated with pictures and images a child can relate to.While the book has four main projects, the goal of the book isn't about the objects being made, but the basic knowledge of tools and tool safety that is involved. Each project adds a few new elements to show the kids new tricks. It will hopefully demystify the garage and "Dad's tools" for your kids.This is a great book. I could not recommend more highly. It is a book for both parent and child. Parents should guide, encourage, and always congratulate their little workers as they march their way through this book.

I got this book as much for me as for my 12-year-old son. My thought was that we could learn and make something together. After all, I never had anyone teach me how to use tools so this book seemed perfect for a newbie like me and my son. I like that there are some kid-friendly projects (Wizard's Wand) and practical (charging stand, secret compartment box) projects in the book. The book walks you through each project -- including materials needed and each step -- and includes simple diagrams and illustrations to help you complete each project. Everything seems fairly straightforward but, at the same time, doesn't seem like it is "dumbed down" for kids. You're using real tools and wood to make real projects. If, like me, you want a way to introduce yourself and your kids to using tools and exploring the possibilities for woodworking, this seems like a great book for accomplishing this goal.Caveat: We haven't yet tried to make any of the projects yet (we plan on doing this over the summer months), but I'll try to remember to come back give a report on the results once we do.

This book allows for a nice introduction to making items with tools. Mostly our kids "make" using cardboard and tape, so this was a step up in a way. Some hand tools, some electric. We had the basic tools like, like a hammer and wood, though to make it easier you will need a saw (hand or electric) and a drill. It definitely talks a lot about safety. The "maker" is a red robot like thing, not particularly appealing to all but I can see how some kids would like it. I like that the kids are equally male and female, and more than just Caucasian. There are 4 projects: making a wizard wand, a sanding block, a charging stand (its not as easy as it sounds) and finally a secret compartment box. They also talk about finishing the wood, and eventually how to choose nicer woods. My kids are makers but I am not super creative, so this was a nice way of introducing those concepts and helping ME in a way help them.

This is excellent for homeschoolers. The dad in this household has his own wood shop and young son is interested in being like dad but he's too young to use the electric saws and tools dad uses. This book offers some simple beginner projects that dad can direct so his little guy can enjoy the satisfaction of making something. Our philosophy of homeschool is to teach life skills along with academics and this is a good unit for our little guy.

My nine year old son is very interested in woodworking. Dad (me) has a full workshop, but with many dangerous tools and equipment. Now that he is out for Summer Vacation, he really wanted to

do some wood projects, and this book is the perfect starting point for his entry into the makers world. The projects are well laid out, with detailed instructions, illustrations, and tools/materials needed to complete. The first chapters are for learning safety, tools, and accessories...and all in a language that kids will understand and read easily. The only power tool used in the projects is a drill and rotary tool. Everything else is hand tools, or tools that are "made" like sanding blocks. Excellent intro! My son really likes Harry Potter stories and movies, so the first project in the book to make your own magic wand was a perfect start! He can't wait to do more of the projects in the book. I have other children's woodworking project books, but this one is much better targeted at the KIDS, and not just the adult mentors to follow. Excellent book that will encourage future interests in woodworking by building the projects in the book. Very Pleased!!
