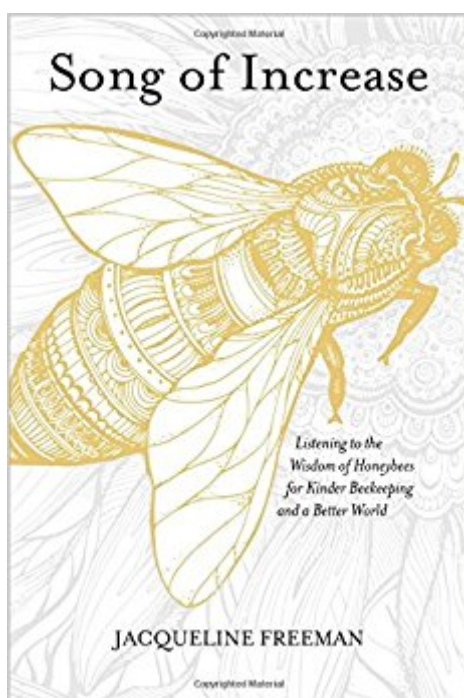

This book requires an open mind. If you do not have an open mind, you will not get much benefit from it. The information is not so much about how to care for bees but more about how to learn from bees through their relationships with nature and with you the steward. Through the teachings of the Bees you will learn about bees also about yourself and your connection with nature. It is part self-help on a spiritual level and part how-to in learning how to listen to what the bees are telling you. The information flows well and the book is easy to read. Much of the book is based on personal observations but other research and authors are cited as well. Resources are listed in the back of the book for further reading and research. I enjoyed this book and am thankful to have discovered it.

You will not wake up with the same consciousness after reading even just the beginning chapters of this book. Is there such a thing as required reading? If so add this to the top of the list. I want to reread it over and over again.
