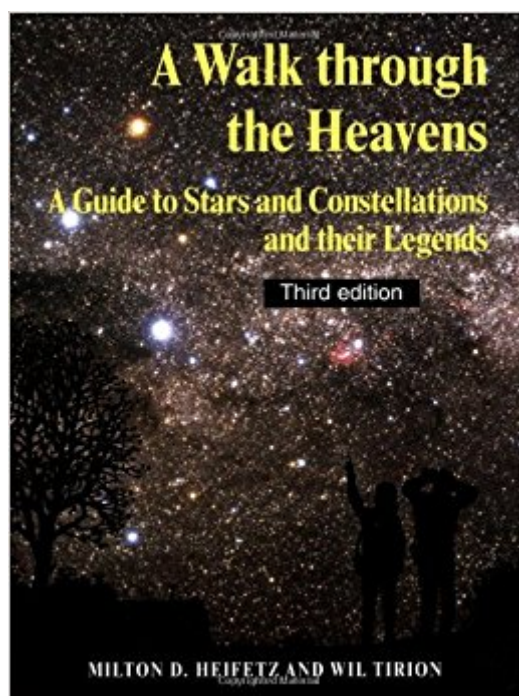

This book has excellent maps, and many interesting star stories. But the author tells us in his introduction that he objects to stories which are too violent, so he edits out the violence or chooses a version which is more to his taste. I strongly object to this sort of editing. I want to find out the real stories that people told, without this sort of moral editing. I prefer to know the real history of the sky myths. Not recommended as your only or first book. May have some use as a book to give to sensitive children who you wish to "protect" from real history.
