

Pierre Berton was born in the Yukon in 1920 and worked in the Klondike mining camps as a teenager before forging a career as a journalist and cultural commentator. He wrote 50 books, including many of historical non-fiction, and won over 30 literary awards and many honorary degrees. Appointed a Companion of the Order of Canada in 1986, Berton died in 2004 at the age of 84. --This text refers to an out of print or unavailable edition of this title.

Of course, this book is meaningless without first reading the story - Pierre Berton's wit and understanding of the gold rush paints a vivid picture like few others manage. Together, these give an unparalleled history lesson as well as many truly great stories. Mr Berton shows his true understanding of the events when in the afterword he draws parallels to young men (and a few women!) going through war and how it changes them - mostly for the better through "aging beyond their years"...So, this book is a keeper - I can't recommend BOTH of them enough!
