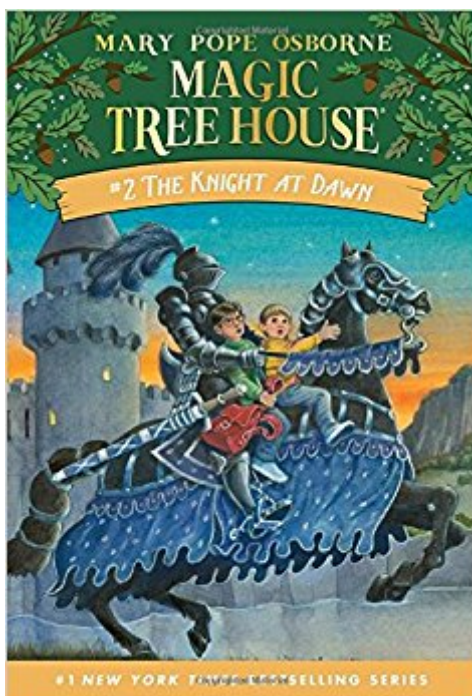

I have read half of this book out loud to my kids and although the books are a bit formulaic, especially the earlier ones in the series, my kids still love them. They have just enough historical details to be interesting but not overloaded to make them boring. I like the relationship between the book worm brother and enthusiastic sister, it's good for my kids to see a cute sibling relationship. This series is a wonderful hit with kids and includes a lot of real facts, which keeps them learning!

My 8 year old daughter loves this book. I have been trying to get her to use her imagination, and she's always telling me she can't picture in her mind what she is reading or what I read to her. Ever since she started reading this book, she keeps saying "I can picture in my mind what this is saying! I can't put this book down!" It makes me happy to hear her say this. It has really captivated her.

My five year old is loving the Magic Tree House series. We read up to five chapters each day. We could probably read the whole book but I like to leave some wonder and anticipation for what happens next. It builds the imagination. I'm building up his collection so he can 1- eventually read them to me and 2- so he can pass them down to his younger brothers.

My nine year old really enjoys these books! He can read them quickly and doesn't feel overwhelmed because it's not too thick. Great book to start working on book reports with.
