

If you like fairy tales and like reading them told in a new light then this might be the book for you. We met Camille who has no memory of her life before the age of 7 but is plagued by nightmares. She is adopted by a family of vampires and ends up falling in love with the son Nicco. It starts slow (but thats just the ground work being laid), what happens as she approached her 16th birthday makes her confront her nightmares and creates a deeper bond between her and Nicco. this story also features little red riding hood and Cinderella all told in a different context. A great young adult read.

Lili St. Crow provides a fresh look at the tale of Snow White and Beauty and the Beast while also keeping this tale completely separate from the original-something not easily done. I would recommend this book to those who have a love of fairy tales, fantasy, and spin offs from the classics.

Lili St Crow is one of the most talented writers I know of. Her book Nameless was wonderful, full of fantasy that had my head spinning. I love a book that I actually have to do some thinking and figuring out. I fell in love with Cami and Nico and I really wish she would make a second book on their life together. Well Done!
