This is another winner for Cynthia Toney in the Bird Face series. I love the way Ms Toney writes for teens and young adults in a manner that let's them know how special and valuable they are. She also touches on life experiences we all face and must deal with, and she does so in such a way as to allow young people to make up their own minds as to what the right choices are. I actually met Cynthia through animal rescue at our local shelter when she was living here in Mississippi so I know

her love and compassion are true. I have thoroughly enjoyed this series and look forward to the next installment.

Cynthia Toney adds more excitement to the saga of Wendy's life in this third book in her Bird Face Series. We meet again with all the old characters and friends, and some new ones. Wendy is learning what it's like to live in a blended family and to be in a relationship with David. She's also missing Mrs. V and Sam and desperately trying to make money to visit them in Alaska. Things are looking up in her new life, but as usual, the good times don't last and real life kicks in. And just when it looks like things could not be worse, they suddenly are. How does Wendy deal with it all? In usual Wendy fashion. 6 Dates to Disaster reminds us that there are consequences to all our actions. It reminds us that true friendships never die. And it reminds us that life is not always fair. If you're a fan of the first two books in this series, you will like this story too. It's a fun book, lined with the usual suspense, and spiced with a taste of Cajun.

The series seems to gradually mature with the main character Wendy. Bird Face book 3 did not disappoint, just be aware (\*\*\*\*spoiler alert!!!\*\*\*\*\*) this one is not (yet?) set in Alaska. I can't wait for the next one!!!

The third installment of the Bird Face series by Cynthia Toney is another winner for young teens. As Wendy attempts to earn money to fund her Alaska summer trip to visit Mrs. V. (and Sam), she finds herself in over her head tutoring classmates. As the demands of her job spiral out of control, everything she cares about could be jeopardized - running track, school, summer plans, and most worrisome - her deepening relationship with boyfriend David.An old friendship is revived with Jennifer, who $\tilde{A}f\hat{A}\phi\tilde{A}$   $\hat{a}$   $\neg\tilde{A}$   $\hat{a}_{,\phi}cs$  also in over her head. Life can be horribly unfair, especially if you are a teen. Or so you may think. Sometimes parents can be right, but not all adult decisions seem just and reasonable. However, as in the earlier books of the Bird Face Series, deep down inside, Wendy loves widely and deeply.Her romantic love of David Griffin flourishes into something far beyond physical attraction. Her friendship with her stepsister Alice and her distant cousin Gayle deepen into tender generosity. Her concern for Mrs. Villaturo, who moved from their old neighborhood, drives Wendy to exhaustion as she tries to earn her way to Alaska to visit Mrs. V. and her grandson, Sam. WendyÃf¢Ã â  $\neg$ à â,,¢s former best friend, Jennifer, returns to her life, and Wendy realizes how much Jennifer still means to her. Wendy even grows closer, mainly through adversity, to her mother and stepfather as their new family gels together.Wendy grew up in poverty. Ăf¢Ã â  $\neg$ à Å"Salvaging and recycling (are) in (her) blood.Ăf¢Ã â  $\neg$ à Å•Her mother had furnished their tiny house with discards and flea market finds. Penny-pinching comes naturally to mother and daughter. When Cathy Robichaud married Daniel Rend in the previous book, Wendy not only gained Alice, her stepsister, and Adam, her stepbrother, but she moved to a larger house and entered a world of greater affluence.When Daniel loses his job, Wendy shifts back to frugal mode and prepares to earn her way to Alaska. Although shunned by the
