Brady tries really hard to keep Reed away, but he cannot deny the magnetic pull this kid has. This is a slow burn, but, I was glued to every single page without wanting more to happen any faster. I. Because of a scandal that Reed caused, his mother ships him off to Wyoming to live with her deceased cousin Robert's wife. That wife, Mona and their adoptive son Brady, are still mourning the loss of Robert, who Reed has never even met. But as Mona and Brady begin to help Reed move past his mistakes, he helps them to move on from their loss by reminding them of the best parts of Robert. You get to see Reed grow as a person, moving away from his selfishness and pettiness. You see Brady and Mona, grieve but also learn that it's ok to regain happiness after a loved one dies.
