

After an introduction of studio essentials, six chapters of crafts are followed by templates, two appendices, principles, resources, further reading, acknowledgments, and an index. The six divisions cover abstract and geometric patterns, everyday patterns, custom motifs, occasions and celebrations, flora and fauna, and travel-inspired patterns. From dyed washer paper, a carve-a-stamp, monogram leather clutch, drawing with chocolate, animal tessellation, and a mud cloth pillow, over thirty projects are given. Each design has the time, level of difficulty, type of learning skill, remix, and materials in a column on the left side of the page with a description, numbered instructions, and photographs on the rest of the opened pages.~Why ~Having a degree in art, I love working with different mediums, including working with tie-dying silk. I like the layout and plethora of information and suggestions in this book as it helps both the novice and seasoned artist. The projects that I may try are stamped clay ornaments, wax seal, and the DIY delftware. With the materials needed listed, the book gave me more ideas as I have never worked with embossing powder, Saral transfer paper, and solar dye and wash. I love that the book included the vast array of templates and explanation of materials and tools at the back.~ Why Not ~Those who do not like DIY crafts or creating homemade items will shy away from this designer book. Whether it be paint, paper, dye, stamps, upholstering, applique....whatever medium you prefer, this book of chock full of ideas that will inspire you to try something new to decorate your home and put a personal "stamp" (haha) on it making it unique and one of a kind that suits your personal taste. Personally, I can't wait to try transferring the provided patterns and creating my own delftware. And drawing with chocolate? Yep, I'm in! From edibles to chairs to clothing and cards, this book contains something for the most veteran crafter down to the person who may make one item a year or less. Directions are very clear. Colorful examples are provided to give you an idea what you may want

your finished product to look like. Probably the most helpful information is the difficulty level of each projects. The sturdy paperback opens with ideas for supplies and ends with a recommended list of resources where you may find everything you need for your projects. A handy index makes it simple to locate a project you need. A variety of patterns are also within the pages along with an appendix with extra information on craft supplies along with the author's preferences when selecting supplies. A few of the required supplies are unfamiliar to me but I will admit I am a crafter only in certain seasons of my life. I did receive this book free from the publisher in exchange for an honest review and am in no way obligated to write a positive one. Two thumbs up Christine Schmidt and Yellow Owl Workshops for offering such a variety of decorator craft ideas and making it clear and easy enough even for this crafter. Off to find supplies for that delftware!

This how-to book is adorable! I wasn't sure what to expect before it arrived because I've ordered some similar books and been disappointed with the lack of details and small size. This book exceeded my expectations. There are many projects, ranging from creating simple monogrammed note cards to stamping fabric for a quilt (and pillows) to how to add fun details to leather clutches to even creating designs on cookies. Some of the projects are easier than others, and each project has a difficulty assigned to it to help the reader understand what they're getting into before beginning. The variety of projects is fabulous. I wasn't interested in each one, but enough of them that I find this book a valuable tool. As far as the instructions on how to create any stamps, I found the book informative. It wasn't overly informative, so if you learn by having someone show you by example (and don't necessarily learn by reading instructions), I could see the book being a bit of struggle. However, I think there's enough detail to get you started, especially with the simple stamping.
