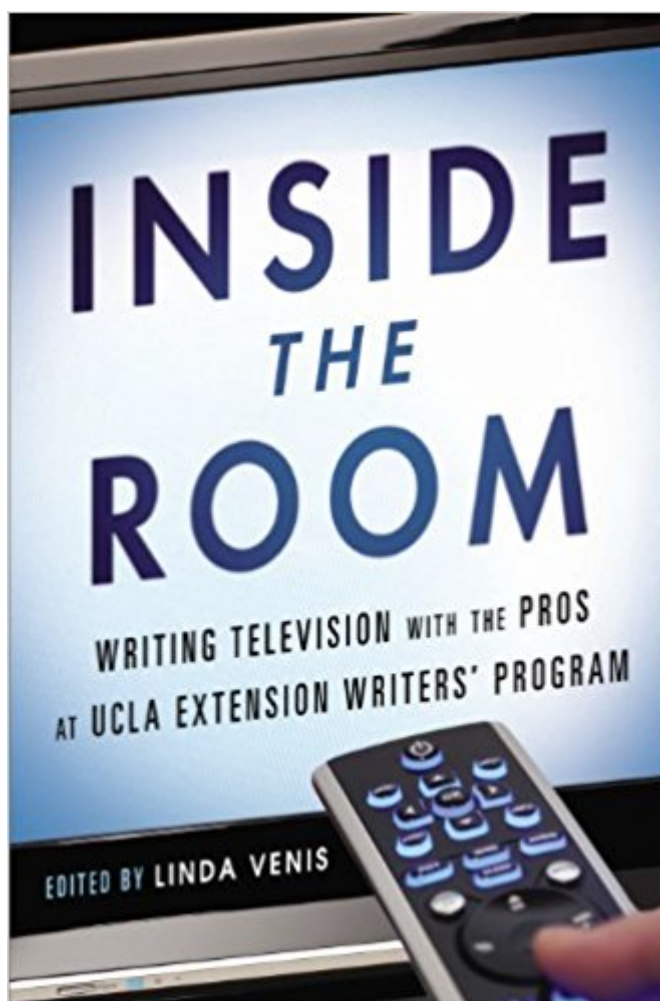


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Inside The Room: Writing Television With The Pros At UCLA Extension Writers' Program
