

Synopsis

The New York Timesâ⠬⠜bestselling author Donald McCaig has established an expansive literary career, founded equally on books about working sheepdogs and the Civil War novels Jacob $\tilde{A}\phi\hat{a}$ $\neg \hat{a}_{,,\phi}$ s Ladder and Rhett Butler $\tilde{A}\phi\hat{a}$ $\neg \hat{a}_{,,\phi}$ s People, the official sequel to Gone with the Wind. McCaig engagingly chronicles the often grueling experience A¢â ¬â ¢through rain, snow, ice storms, and brain-numbing heatâ⠬⠢of preparing and trialing Mrs. Dog, June, "a foxy lady in a slinky black-and-white peignoir," and Mr. Dog, Luke, "a plain workerâ⠬⠢no flash to him." Along the way, he relays sage advice from his decades spent talking with Americaââ ¬â,,¢s most renowned dog experts, from police-dog trainers to positive-training gurus. As readers of McCaigââ ¬â,,¢s novels will expect, Mr. and Mrs. Dog delivers far more than straightforward dog-training tips. Revealing an abiding love and respect for his dogs, McCaig unveils the life experiences that set him on the long road to the Welsh trial fields. Starting with memories of his first dog, Rascal, and their Montana roadtrip in a ¢â ¬â,,¢48 Dodge, McCaig leads us into his thirties, when he abandons his New York advertising career to move to a run-down Appalachian sheep farm in the least populous county in Virginia. This 1960s agrarian adventure ultimately brings McCaig, Luke, and June to the Olympics of sheepdog trials. In his narration of one man $\hat{A}\phi\hat{a}$ $\neg \hat{a},\phi$ s love for his dogs, McCaig offers a powerful portrayal of the connection between humans and their animal companions.

would really like this book as much as those of us who do have Border Collies. Donald McCaig is a familiar name to followers of sheepdog trialing in the U.S., both for his many books about dogs and training, and for his presence as a handler at many trials. He mentions people who are well-known trainers and handlers whose work I have seen at the National Sheepdog Finals when they have been held near Klamath Falls, Oregon. It is an amazing demonstration of inter-species cooperation and understanding. This book chronicles his attempt to qualify one or both of his two dogs, Luke and June, for a place on the American team which will compete in Wales at the World Sheepdog Trial. Along the way he tells the history of the many types of training available to owners of pet dogs today, while revealing only a little of his own bias toward any of them. Some of the ideas, like clicker training, positive reinforcement only training, and electronic collar training are pretty well-known, but he expands on their histories and philosophies. McCaig calls on the promoters of these and other training methods to see for himself why they work or if they work. That was all interesting, but not as much fun as his stories about his own experiences with his own dogs. The next time I go to a local or national sheepdog trial I will have a better appreciation of how it feels to do this very complex work with dogs, and, of course, sheep. I loved this book.

Very enjoyable reading. As a stockdog person, I identified with Donald McCaig's book, and felt that it was as delightfully written as any he has produced. It made me laugh, cry, and THINK deeply about the loves of my life - my sheepdogs. But it is not just for sheepdog people at all - it is an exploration of the connection and the communication between man and dog that takes the reader to many different places and explores/observes the many different ideas and methods that we humans have devised to train our dogs. For anyone who sincerely loves and values the relationships we have with our dogs, this is a great book. When I had finished this book, I wanted to flip it over, go back to the first page, and begin reading it all over again.

The story of McCaig's quest for a world title was interesting and provided some insight into the world of herding competition. The story is probably more interesting because McCaig and his dogs are very good but not world beaters. They have to struggle and pick up some lucky breaks in order to have a shot at the dream. The author intermixes some interesting tidbits about training dogs. With all of that the narrative moves along at a nice pace.

McCaig does it again. He had given us a book full of information and insights. Lots of hard info comparing different training methods and philosophies, and lots of McCaig personality thrown in. I

feel as though I know him AND his two wonderful dogs. Having been to watch sheepdog trials, it is very satisfying to have the back story filled in for me.
