The Strobist website and community is about one thing: Learning how to use off-camera flash with your DSLR to take your photos to the next level. Or the next ten levels.

The info is good. It's got pictures and lighting diagrams with brief descriptions of what the photographer did. Exif data and flash settings are absent, but as David Hobby says, chimp it 'til it looks right. The one issue I have with this, that prevents it from having that extra star, is that photos in portrait orientation are reproduced on the Kindle in landscape. It's fine for a printed book, but Kindle reorients the page when the screen is reoriented, thus maintaining the wrongness of the display for these photos. It's rather annoying.

This book is a VERY short read. Each section of the book is a one paragraph write up about a single photo which is displayed at the start of each section. At the end is a basic diagram of how the photo was shot but almost no exposure, iso, or shutter information is given (with a few exceptions for shutter speed.) Coming in at just 24 pictures you can read this book in half an hour if you go slow. On the Kindle version all of the vertical oriented photos are horizontal so you need to keep flipping your device to view them properly. Find something else to read.

This is a clear and simple book with pull out cards that provide the details on the lighting used to effect the images. Try to replicate some of the images and you will expand your understanding of lighting. A decent acquisition esp. for beginners at any price under \$20.

When I got the books, I was excited at the fact that the images were printed on one side and the

lighting setups were on the opposite side. The pages are thick, very nice, glossy card stock, and perforated so that you may remove the pages and take them on location with you. The only thing I'd wish for would be more pages.. Glad this came in 2 volumes and I got them both at the same time. Both versions have a nice variety of images and lighting setups so I'd definitely advise getting them both.

I wanted to learn more about HOW to use strobes to make great photos. Instead I got a photo album in the form of postcards, with scant information except lighting diagrams that are none too informative. It's disappointing. But there are some terrific photos in this. I just want to know more about how they were made.

This is a random book of postcards sized pages and pictures, the picture on one side and a brief description on the other side on how it was accomplished. It is fine as a book for new ideas however I thought I was going to get more examples for my money. It looks like one of my kids books or a book of postcards from a foreign country you used to buy before digital cameras, there are some great photos and ideas, it just seems to lack a direction and for the money they could have given more.

Very basic information can be found on the internet. I was hoping to find camera and flash setting information (e.g. Aperture, shutter speed, flash power ..etc)

Very cool for an idea book. However the divulged information was very sparse. I wanted a lot more detail-- what time of day, what strobe power settings, what strobe, camera settings, lens, what was the ambient light reading, etc. Anyway, I was disappointed at the lack of detailed information. Still a cool idea book although for the amount of detail and trouble they put into the book it would be better valued at under \$10.
